

# Undeveloped Waters in Southeastern Vermont

Conditions as of 2009 for the Deerfield, North, and Green River watersheds, 2011 for the lower West and Connecticut Rivers, 2013 for the upper West and Connecticut Rivers.


Undeveloped waters are any waters farther than 300 feet from major structures, travelled roads, railroads, and electric transmission lines. Furthermore, cleared vegetation for agricultural land, ski trails, fields, lawns, and the like, as well as minor driveways, must be at least 100 feet away (vegetation disturbance from logging was not considered development).

Undeveloped river or stream:

-  1st order
-  2nd order
-  3rd order
-  4th order
-  5th order or higher
-  River, order not specified

Undeveloped lake or pond shore:

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-  Developed river, stream, lake, or pond shore




## 10 acres and greater

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# Conservation Status of Undeveloped Waters in Southeastern Vermont

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
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Undeveloped river, stream, lake, or pond:

 Conserved waters \*


 Unconserved waters

 - in public ownership and used wholly or in part for open space, recreation, or conservation;  
 - privately-owned and under conservation easement; or  
 - owned by a conservation organization.

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



# Town Plans and Undeveloped Waters in Southeastern Vermont

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Town Plan Land Use District of undeveloped river, stream, lake, or pond:

-  Conservation/reserve lands
-  Rural lands: strong conservation priority
-  Rural lands: some conservation priority
-  Rural lands: little to no conservation priority
-  Development priority
-  no land use plan
-  Conserved land
-  Developed river, stream, lake, or pond shore



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
