 - high



- Shoulder suitability:

- Unpaved road on system:
- Paved road, not on bicycle network
 - Unpaved road, not on bicycle network

- Urban riding conditions:
- Significant grade (arrow points uphill)

- Interstate (cycling prohibited)
- Railroad
- Town boundary
- Stream
- Lake, pond, or river
